The Australian Access Federation (AAF) is Australia's leading specialist in Trust and Identity for higher education and research. We are connected to an international community of scientists and researchers building applications and solutions that make up part of the Australian Government's eResearch infrastructure strategy. We work with universities and research institutions including CSIRO to provide access to resources that tackle issues in health, life science and astrophysics... just to name a few.

The AAF is the lead for the Australian ORCID Consortium which is a community of Australian organisations that takes a national approach to ORCID adoption and integration. ORCID, which stands for Open Researcher and Contributor ID, is a global initiative whose mission is to enable transparent and trustworthy connections between researchers and their research contribution. As consortium lead, AAF provides local support, assists with member ORCID integrations, and encourages national uptake of ORCID within organisations. We also help members understand the benefits of their ORCID membership and how to get the most of it. Among global ORCID consortia leads, the AAF is considered an exemplar in terms of how the consortium is run and members are supported.

We are transforming Australia's research, teaching, and learning communities by delivering innovative solutions that provide secure access to high-value digital resources and infrastructure.

The Role

We're looking for an experienced policy analyst who understands different research community expectations. The role will be responsible for developing policies to establish common expectations between members of research communities initially and assist with internal AAF policy development. You will also adapt policy templates from international frameworks that create trust between partner organisations by clarifying expectations in areas like user identity, privacy, research infrastructure operations, and security incident response.

Your duties will include interviewing stakeholders to understand key requirements, drafting and tuning template policies to the needs of the research collaboration, assisting infrastructure providers to implement policies and suggesting improvements to the policy framework.

You will have demonstrated experience in policy development and implementation and strong stakeholder consultation skills. You will be responsible for ensuring a positive experience for project partners as you provide policy advice to current and potential collaborators.

The role will work with multiple teams across AAF including, eResearch, product development, product delivery and operations. You will also work closely with AAF collaborators from universities, research organisations, government and industry.

Key Responsibilities

- Consult researchers and research infrastructure providers to understand policy needs.
- Adapt template policies to align with stated goals and objectives.
- Identify benefits, disadvantages, and omissions in the existing policy framework.
- Adapt the policy framework as needed to meet Australian legal requirements.
- Report findings and propose new policies or amendments to existing policies.
- Draft new policies or amendments to policies.
- Undertake research and analysis relevant to AAF teams and collaborators.
- Support continuous improvement.
- Provide support to the Head, eResearch and other AAF teams as directed.

Your experience and skills

We seek a motivated, organised and pro-active person to contribute to our team. You will have highly developed interpersonal, relationship management and customer service skills, the ability to work across teams together with demonstrated experience in developing and implement policy within large organisations. You will be comfortable working autonomously.

Qualifications

A tertiary qualification in business, public policy or other relevant disciplines or equivalent work experience.

Selection Criteria

- 1. Demonstrated experience in analysing, developing and implementing policy within complex organisations.
- 2. Ability to understand the policy implications of new legislation and to update existing policies to accommodate legislative requirements.
- 3. Demonstrated experience in working with diverse stakeholder groups to understand identify requirements and concerns that influence policy development.
- 4. Experience in preparing complex reports and presenting findings.
- 5. Excellent recordkeeping and communication skills.
- 6. Demonstrated ability to provide leadership in the development of a client focussed, continuous improvement and quality assurance culture within a complex technological environment.
- 7. Ability to work effectively with general direction and minimum supervision and independently represent and act on behalf of an organisation in a broad range of situations and environments.
